MOURO WALL HANGER

US crochet terms used throughout. Abbreviations: st(s) = stitch(es), sl st = slip stitch

Design: Lankava, Molla Mills **Finished size:** 90x130 cm

Yarn: 2.4 kg of Frotee Loopy Craft Yarn in Blue (74), and 2.4 kg in Marshmallow (910) (80% recycled cotton, 20% polyester, 1.2 kg = approx. 220 m).

Crochet hook: 7 mm (US K-L), or according to per-

sonal gauge

Other supplies: 100x150 cm piece of White (01) Stafil plastic net (100% polypropylene, width: 100 cm), scissors, textile glue (Gütermann), tapestry needle, strong sewing thread (e.g. Coats Bear thread Nr. 30), and a 105 cm curtain rod.

Instructions: Take the 100x150 cm piece of Stafil net and cut the upper and bottom edges straight. Use sI sts to crochet the work. Work according to the chart from the bottom upwards, one color area at the time. Begin with the background color from the bottom right corner of the net (= 5th square counting inwards both from the bottom edge and the right edge), as follows: take the hook through the square and bring it back through the next square upwards, yarn over hook and pull through the st on hook = 1 sl st. Keep working sl sts according to the chart and keep the yarn always on the right side of the work. Make sure the varn runs smoothly and the net stays flat. Work all the sts of one row in the same direction. When you need to turn, make 1 sl st for turning and continue back along the next row. Try to cover as large areas as possible with the color in use without breaking the yarn. Leave an approx. 7 cm tail at both ends of a yarn and knot the ends tightly to keep the yarn from unravelling.



Finishing: Cut away the tightly woven vertical edges of the net. Fold in empty squares from each edge on the wrong side of the work. Cut the extra squares off from the upper edge. Weave in the yarn tails and use textile glue to secure the ends. Put the curtain rod into the upper edge.

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
